November 3, 2009 City/School/Special District Elections Report of the Official Canvass and 1% Manual Tally

Official Canvass of the Vote. The official canvass was completed and the election certified on Monday, November 23, 2009. The official canvass consisted of several steps, including an inspection of all materials and supplies returned from each polling place, processing and counting vote by mail ballots and ballots cast at and returned from each precinct, including provisional ballots, a reconciliation of signatures in roster indexes with votes recorded, a reconciliation of ballots counted with the number of votes recorded, a manual tally of the ballots tabulated by the voting systems at 1% of the precincts, and a 100% manual tally of all votes cast on any AVC Edge II (touch-screen) voting machine. The Department notified the public of the schedule of activities of the official canvass and invited the Observer Panel, political party central committees, and the Civil Grand Jury to observe. There was one member of the public present to observe the manual tally of one precinct.

Manual Tally. The 1% manual tally includes ballots cast from randomly selected precincts and includes both paper ballots and accessible touch-screen voting machine ballots as well as vote by mail ballots centrally tabulated at the Monterey County Elections Department. The "one percent manual tally" is defined by Elections Code Section 336.5 as "the public process of manually tallying votes in 1 percent of the precincts, selected at random by the elections official, and in one precinct for each race not included in the randomly selected precincts. This procedure is conducted during the official canvass to verify the accuracy of the automated count." Based upon the 2007 Post-Election Audit Standards that have been temporarily incorporated into the California Administrative Code (Regulations), the manual tally and determination of any increased audits for close contests should be based upon the semi-final official canvass, or election night results, as defined in Elections Code Section 353.5. The Regulations were re-adopted for the May 19, 2009 Statewide Special Election and sunset on July 19, 2009.

On Tuesday, November 17, 2009, at 9:00 a.m. the Elections Department conducted a public random selection of precincts for the 1% manual tally. The Department used four 10-sided colored dice that were rolled to randomly generate precinct numbers. On Thursday, November 19, the Department opted to randomly select an additional precinct for the Greenfield Unified School District, long term, as the final results reflected a new winner to the contest and the vote spread was just outside of the parameters for the Post-Election Manual Tally requirements. The following table represents the random draw.

^{*}The vote by mail ballots for Precinct 2045 were also included in the manual tally. During the manual tally of write-in votes, staff discovered that one write-in ballot reflected the voter connecting the vote target next to the candidate name on the ballot and also writing the candidate name in the write-in space and also connecting the vote target. The machine considered this "Vote for One" contest overvoted, and the candidate contests were not tallied by the machine. The ballot was manually tallied to capture the candidate contest votes. See below.

<u>Increased Sample Size for Close Contests.</u> There were no contests with a margin of victory close enough to require implementation of the Post-Election Manual Tally requirements. However, the Department opted to select an additional precinct for the Greenfield Unified School District long term contest as the final results came close to meeting the Post-Election Manual Tally requirements.

<u>Results of the Manual Tally.</u> The results of the manual tally confirmed the results of the election were reflected accurately. The machine results for each precinct selected balanced with the results of manual tally, excluding the variances found below:
