WAS CHARTED BY CONGRESS IN 1919 AFTER THE END OF WWI AS A PATRIOTIC, MUTUAL HELP, VETERANS' ORGANIZATION. A COMMUNITY SERVICE ORGANIZATION WHICH NOW NUMBERS MORE THAN 3 MILLION MEMBERS IN NEARLY 15,000 AMERICAN LEGION POSTS WORLDWIDE, THE AMERICAN LEGION PROMOTES AND SUPPORTS VETERANS' PROGRAMS AS WELL AS PROMOTES OUR YOUTH AND CIVIC AWARENESS.

MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY IN THE AMERICAN LEGION IS BASED ON HONORABLE FEDERAL ACTIVE DUTY WITH THE U.S. ARMED FORCES. MEMBERSHIP IN THE SONS OF THE AMERICAN LEGION (SAL) IS OPEN TO MALES WHOSE PARENTS OR GRANDPARENTS SERVED IN THE U.S. ARMED FORCES.

MEMBERSHIP IN THE AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY IS OPEN TO MALE AND FEMALE SPOUSES, GRANDMOTHERS, MOTHERS, SISTERS, AND ADOPTED FEMALE DESCENDANTS OF AMERICAN LEGION MEMBERS.

AMERICAN LEGION POST 512 CARMEL WAS CHARTERED 83 YEARS AGO ON APRIL 22, 1935 AND HAS BEEN A PART OF THE CARMEL COMMUNITY EVER SINCE. DURING WWII THE POST WAS USED AS A USO CLUB WHEN MOST MEMBERS WERE IN SERVICE TO THEIR COUNTRY IN EUROPE, AFRICA AND THE PACIFIC. LOCATED AT DOLORES, BETWEEN 8TH AND 9TH, IT REMAINS AS ONE OF CARMEL'S OLDEST AND MOST UNIQUE STRUCTURES.

AFTER THE CEREMONY THE COMMUNITY IS INVITED BACK TO AMERICAN LEGION POST 512 (DOLORES JUST SE OF EIGHTH) FOR A BBQ AND POTLUCK LUNCH, COURTESY OF THE POST 512 AUXILIARY AND THE SONS OF THE AMERICAN LEGION. PLEASE JOIN US.
