Fire Hazard Severity Zones

- evaluate wildfire hazards (physical conditions)
 creating a likelihood an area will burn over a 30- to 50year period
- designate areas where California's wildland urban interface building codes apply to new buildings
- local governments consider fire hazard severity in the safety elements of their general plans
- meant to help limit wildfire damage to structures through planning, prevention, and mitigation activities/requirements that reduce risk




