#### C. Officers

#### 1. Selection

- a. A Chair and Vice-Chair shall be elected annually from among the Commission's membership at the beginning of the January meeting to serve at the pleasure of the Commission
- b. The elections process commences with individual Commissioners nominating candidates until a motion is made, seconded and approved to close nominations. At the conclusion of any discussion, the roll is called alphabetically and each Commissioner votes for one of the nominated candidates until one is elected by simple majority. The newly elected or reelected Chairman takes the Chair's seat and repeats this process for the Vice Chair.
- c. The Vice-Chair shall succeed the Chair if he/she vacated his/her office before his/her term is completed, the Vice-Chair to serve the unexpired term of the vacated office. A new Vice Chair shall be elected at the next regular meeting.
- d. In the absence of the Chair and Vice-Chair, any other member shall call the Commission to order, whereupon a Chair shall be elected from the members present to preside.
- e. The terms of office of the Chair and Vice-Chair shall not exceed two (2) consecutive terms.

The Vice-Chair position, which was filled by former Commissioner Downing, is currently vacant.

### ANALYSIS/DISCUSSION:

The sixth annual Run in the Name of Love 5K and 2K event is scheduled to take place on Sunday, June 19, 2016. Approximately 1,000 people are expected to participate.

The run/walk course is the same as last year, with the event beginning at Sunset Center and finishing in the Del Mar parking lot at the foot of Ocean Avenue. In 2015, event organizers secured a 5-year Coastal Development Permit from the City Planning and Building Department to close the Del Mar Parking lot.

Event organizer Susan Love, Director of the Just Run Program, is requesting a waiver of eligible event fees. Because there are no proposed changes to this year's event, fees which are eligible to be waived will remain the same as last year: \$4052.

There are several issues that the commission will want to consider when formulating a recommendation to the City Council with respect to this fee waiver request, the most compelling of which is the fact that all but \$3,150 of the City's annual budget for fee waivers (\$27,500) has been allocated to other events this fiscal year. Run in the Name of Love's fee waiver request in the amount of \$4052 exceeds the amount remaining in the budget. In addition, the commission will be considering a fee waiver request from another organization at the February 2016 meeting.

City Policy C12-02 provides guidelines for special event fee waivers. Policy considerations applicable to this request are as follows:

- The number of years for which an organization will be eligible for ongoing waivers of fees for the same event shall be no more than three years from the inception of the event. Run in the Name of Love has received an annual fee waiver from the City since 2012.
- Charitable contributions will be made to charitable organizations within the 93921 zip code area. The beneficiary of the event, Just Run, is not in the 93921 zip code area. The parent organization, Big Sur International Marathon, does contribute to charities in the 93921 area code; however, the Run in the Name of Love event does not.
- Priority will be given to organizations that provide educational and/or community programs and events that are open to the general public free of charge.

The Community Activities and Cultural Commission considered Run in the Name of Love's 2015 fee waiver request, and made the following recommendation to the City Council: "consider the fee waiver

request even though it is not consistent with the fee waiver policy". The City Council granted the fee waiver on the basis of the CA&CC's recommendation.



# 1. Risk Assessment & Plan

BSIM Executive Director Doug Thurston, BSIM Asst Race Director Chris Balog, RNL Race Director Susan Love and RNL Start Director/Legal Counsel Doug Oldfield met on May 15, 2014 to assess the risks of the event and create this Emergency Action Plan. The Emergency Action Plan will be circulated to the other directors for comment and action as needed.

# 2. Emergency Prevention & Training

- Intersection volunteers will meet for training with CPD and event directors;
   volunteer duties will be clearly identified and discussed.
- Intersection volunteers will be placed at key intersections to assist participants and control traffic.
- Intersection volunteers will be instructed to bring cell phones to the event.
- Intersection volunteers will be given written cards with contact information and emergency instructions to (1) call 911 in the event of an emergency, (2) block or redirect traffic as needed to protect any injured participant in the roadway, (3) call the roving EMT for assistance and (4) do not move any injured participant who is unconscious or may have a neck or back problem.
- Orange cones will be placed at key intersections.
- "Caution: Runners in the Road" signs will be placed at key locations on course.
- 1 EMT will be stationed at the finish line and another EMT will rove the

course on bicycle; both will have cell phones and/or 2-way radios for communications.

- Public land line locations will be given to course volunteers as an additional communication source.
- A water station will be available on the course and two in the finish area.
- Suspicious or unattended bags will be identified and information relayed to BSIM Director Doug Thurston or Race Director Susan Love for possible action by Carmel PD.

# 3. Emergency Plan Personnel

The directors collaborate with Carmel Police Department, the City of Carmel, the County of Monterey and the California Highway Patrol in planning the event.

Two EMTs will be present at the event, one at the finish area and the other roving the course on a bicycle. Both will be equipped with cell phones and/or 2-way radios for communications as well as a map of the 5k and 2k courses. Both will have emergency contact information with instructions to contact 911 first for medical emergencies and then to contact Susan Love and/or Doug Thurston.

Intersection volunteers will be given written cards with contact information and emergency instructions to (1) call 911 in the event of an emergency, (2) block or redirect traffic as needed to protect any injured participant in the roadway, (3) call the roving EMT for assistance and (4) not move any injured participant who is unconscious or may have a neck or back problem.

The chain of command for emergencies is as follows:

First, BSIM Executive Director Doug Thurston Second, RNL Race Director Susan Love Third, RNL Start Director/Legal Counsel Doug Oldfield Fourth, RNL Board Member Thompson Lange

If the BSIM Executive Director is unavailable, the RNL Race Director should be consulted. If she is unavailable, then the RNL Start Director/Legal Counsel should be consulted, followed by the designated Board Member.

# 4. Emergency Equipment

Carmel PD is actively involved in the event and can summon emergency equipment and personnel as needed.

Key personnel will be equipped with cell phones, 2 way radios and contact information. Emergency calls should be routed first to Doug Thurston and, if unavailable, to Susan Love.

3 or more trucks are used during the event and are available as needed.

The Race Director and others will have access to a bull horn and/or amplification equipment to make announcements including emergency instructions.

# 5. Logistical Problems

# A. Storm Safety Plan

At the discretion of the Race Director, the start of the event may be delayed up to 1 hour or cancelled if any of the following conditions exist: thunderstorm/lightning, "heavy" rain or other emergency.

In the event of inclement weather, event registration and packet pickup will be moved indoors at Sunset Center. In the discretion of the Race Director or Start Director, participant may seek protection in Carpenter Hall at Sunset Center.

Portable tents be assembled at the start and finish areas as needed.

# B. Back Up Personnel

Each director should identify and cross-train another person as a replacement if the director is unable to attend the event due to illness or injury.

# C. Back Up Vehicles

Three or more trucks are used during the event and are available as needed if a truck has mechanical difficulties.

# 6. Follow Up

After the event, a directors' meeting will be held to assess issues and to identify areas in need of improvement. The agreed-upon improvements will be incorporated into the next event.

Feedback should also be encouraged from participants and discussed at the directors' meeting.

#### 7. Conclusion

This emergency action plan outlines the risk assessment and emergency plan,

itemizes emergency prevention and training, identifies the emergency personnel and emergency communication, and addresses logistical problems that can arise before and during the event. This plan is a guideline and each emergency situation will be handled according to the provider's level of training and dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

#### MEDICAL PLAN

An emergency vehicle is provided by the Monterey Firefighters Association; two Emergency Medical Technicians are present and stationed at the finish line area with easy access to Ocean Avenue. The location is indicated on the Del Mar Parking Lot map. An EMT on bike patrols the course and is prepared to assist participants and volunteers in the case of an emergency. All volunteers and committee members are provided with an emergency phone card, phone numbers, and instructions. Additional bike marshals patrol the course to insure the safety of the participants.

### CRITERIA

For the first time following the Run in the Name of Love event, we conducted a post-race survey of the participants. Significantly:

77.5% purchased food or beverages at a Carmel restaurant or coffee establishment

44.8% purchased souvenirs, merchandise or services in Carmel

89.6% brought someone with them

45% ran/walked as a tribute to a loved one

32.5% traveled to the area specifically for the event

83.7% are "very likely" to participate in this event (most of the others because of distance).

All areas of event orchestration received a 1 point something rating, based on 1 being excellent.

Our goals for Run in the Name of Love are to showcase Carmel-by-the-Sea, offer a sporting event for the community and visitors of all ages, and to have a positive economic impact on our local shops, restaurants, and inns. During the 2015 event, 15 states, 5 foreign countries and over 50 cities were represented. We are anticipating 800 to 1,000 participants this year and, again, many will have numerous friends and family members accompanying them.

The feedback from city businesses has been overwhelmingly positive. Shops and restaurants are frequented and many of the out of town participants make a vacation weekend out of the event. Many of our runners and walker now make Run in the Name of Love an annual event; some will be returning for their sixth year. This event clearly brings people to Carmel-by-the-Sea.

"Just a comment I want to send you. I walked around Carmel a lot with my family after and wore the RNL shirt and in 3 different stores in Carmel either a salesperson or owner said something similar, "we've seen a lot of people today walking around in those shirts." I also saw a lot of people with RNL shirts or race numbers on eating in local restaurants. All outside – beautiful day after the race." Michael D. Salinas participant

The free raffle prizes are a highlight of the finish celebration. Publicity is afforded to our raffle donors: all who are local business owners. They are publically thanked at our awards ceremony, on our website and in the newspaper (see attached) and the participants have continued to patronize their businesses.

Most of our sponsors are local and they have profited by the exposure on our website, in the media, and on race day.

Carmel-by-the-Sea has been greatly promoted by the event. Carmel is showcased in thousands of postcards distributed up and down the coast of California as well as in advertisements and

magazines, newspapers and radio and TV. The Run in the Name of Love website displays beautiful photos of Carmel.

This past year, Carmel-by-the-Sea has been given a Platinum sponsor designation in exchange for valuable fee waivers. The benefits included listing Carmel-by-the-Sea on the participant shirts, a link on our website, and acknowledgements many times during pre- and post-event ceremonies. We have been very proud to have had Carmel's support and its commitment to bringing Run in the Name of Love to our community during the past five years. We would be honored to have Carmel remain on our list of Carmel sponsors and donors.

The organizing committee is composed solely of volunteers, committed to the goals and purpose of Run in the Name of Love and willing to work on behalf of this city and the positive impact it has on our community.

The impact that this event has on our participants as they reflect upon and honor someone who is or was a special person in their lives is moving. We hope that you can join us on June 19th to see and appreciate what this event means to so many people. Many testimonials were submitted to us in the post event survey. Some are attached.

Additionally, this event encourages participation in an athletic endeavor from all age groups. Last year our youngest participant was 2, the oldest was 89. There is a 5K distance and a 2K distance to ensure that almost anyone interested is capable of participating.

One hundred percent of the proceeds from Run in the Name of Love will be donated to the Big Sur International Marathon's youth fitness program JUST RUN. JUST RUN is free to all youth organizations and schools. It promotes physical activity, good citizenship, healthy eating, and pride in accomplishment. The program relies on grants, donations, and sponsorships. JUST RUN won the 2015 National Program of the Year award from Running USA, the trade organization in running. Carmel's support identifies the City as a supporter of youth fitness and a supporter of this highly acclaimed and effective program for children. We can think of no greater cause.

According to the City's police department, there have been zero complaints from residents and businesses during the past five years. We respect the guidelines and agreed-upon stipulations. Residents along the course are hand-delivered letters and postcards explaining the event and welcoming their comments and feedback. The impact of Run in the Name of Love is undeniably positive.

The Coastal Commission's stipulation that we cannot conduct an auction or sell raffle tickets, combined with the potential costs of the parking lot fees, equals a \$6,000 negative financial impact. Thus, we are requesting that the eligible fees be waived to support our efforts to continually orchestrate Run in the Name of Love and to raise money for JUST RUN. We are hopeful that Carmel-by-the-Sea will support us during our 2016 presentation and remain a cosponsor.
